## Defibrillator Update



I'm sure you remember the Night for Life, organised by Malcolm France, with the support of the BCS, to raise money for a defibrillator for the village. The event raised the fantastic amount of £1,950. In addition to this a defibrillator was donated to The Anglers Rest.

Malcolm decided to use the funds to purchase an additional two defibrillators, one for Sickleholme Garage (as it is open 24 hrs) and one for the Yorkshire Bridge Inn (given their proximity to large numbers of walkers and cyclists). These have been purchased and handed over. Well done to Malcolm for his very successful fundraising!

The BCS Board are keen that the defibrillator at The Anglers Rest is externally mounted in a special box with a key code combination. This means that the Defibrillator will be available to all, 24hours a day. The combination will be shared with the Ambulance Service and will be given to anyone who calls the Emergency Services.

However, the remaining funding is slightly short of the amount needed to purchase and install the box. We are hoping that some people feel able to make a further, small contribution, toward the costs. This will enable us to have the kit fully installed and available by early June. Collecting tins will be available in the Anglers if you feel you would like to help.

## Keeping Members Informed

As Directors we are focussed on making sure the Anglers Rest lives up to all our dreams and aspirations as a community-owned business. This means delivering a pub, café & PO that is welcoming and offers the drink, food & postal services that our community wants. And most importantly, this needs to be done in a profitable way so that we can guarantee we'll still be serving our customers next year and for many decades to come.

As we are owned by our members, most of whom live within the area, we have an additional responsibility to ensure that you are kept informed. We do this through the Annual General Meeting (and any additional Extraordinary General Meetings), via occasional e-mails, as well as through this monthly newsletter.

We have recently decided to produce a summary of each BCS Directors' Meeting and to publish them in our newsletters. This is an extension of our commitment to publish our minutes. When we reflected on this we realised the minutes were rarely self-explanatory, as they tended to simply list the topics we discussed and our resolutions. The summaries will offer commentaries on the agendas and so should make more sense. Obviously these are confidential to members and they should not be circulated to others. Your feedback on them would be appreciated.


