Bamford -The Live Project - Consultation

Bamford is currently hosting 12 masters students from the Sheffield School of Architecture as they engage in their annual Live Project as part of their degree. The aim of these projects are to give students the opportunity to prototype design concepts in a "real-world" setting, with a particular emphasis on community participation and collaboration with clients and stakeholders.

The students will utilise their diverse skill sets to build on the output from the Village plan consultation and recent traffic survey to develop ideas for a vision for Bamford, looking into the feasibility of cohesive design interventions that can improve the safety and desirability of the main road, the financial viability of the recreation grounds, and the functionality of the Angler's Rest, as well as conceptualising potential additional programmes.

For the last two weeks, the students have been meeting with various parishioners and Angler's Rest staff in order to learn more about the context that they will be working in and have had tours of various parts of Bamford to get a feel for the village. **They will be running a Consultation Event at the Village Institute on Wednesday 15 October 2pm-8pm. Please look out for the leaflets and signs around the village advertising the event.**

The Live Project runs until Friday the 7th of November in which time there will be opportunities to engage with the project. However if you would like to know any more at this stage, please contact Sally Soady on 650279



Meetings at the Angler Rest

Over the last year many groups, clubs, organisations and societies have asked to hold meetings in the Angler Rest or the Rest Café. Each request has been considered separately, and in a spirit of community commitment we have usually said "Yes". However, we are fortunate that we have within Bamford a number of excellent rooms & spaces for hire (e.g. the Bamford Village Institute & the Moore Memorial Hall). We want the Anglers Rest to compliment the facilities within Bamford and we never want to compete with them. We'd encourage all groups, clubs, organisations and societies to support these other facilities to ensure their economic viability in the future.

As the Directors prepare for a less hands-on approach to running the Anglers Rest with the appointment of our permanent management team under General Manager Amanda Taylor, we wanted to establish some principles for the future.

With immediate effect this is our policy:

1. Groups, clubs, organisations and societies who are holding open meetings; that is meetings or events, open and free to any members of the public, will normally be able to use the pub or the café. For this there will be no charge. We do, however, reserve the right to refuse such access as there will be occasions when we are anticipating being full.
2. Groups, clubs, organisations and societies who are holding closed meetings, that is meetings or events, not open to the public, will not be able to book exclusive use of a room in the pub or the café.

Obviously groups, clubs, organisations and societies are welcome to book tables or even a whole room for a meeting when accompanied by meals purchased at the Anglers. In the same way many groups will continue to meet in the pub & café to discuss matters over a pint or a latté.


